# AFJA TROPHY SERIES - ROUND 6 RACE REPORT- EASTERN CREEK "TASMAN REVIVAL"

The final event for the AFJA Trophy Series, and Golden Jubilee 50<sup>TH</sup> anniversary celebration of Formula Junior in Australia was held over four days at Eastern Creek NSW as part of the Tasman Revival Series, where cars from around the globe descended on this circuit to celebrate the 1960's Tasman Series and their cars.

There were 22 FJ/F3 cars entered of which 2 from Qld were withdrawn due to preparation for the forthcoming Formula Junior final of the World Cup in South Africa, Howard Tucker's Lynx had mechanical problems and was unable to race, and Geoff Medley's Nota experienced a major steering malfunction during practice, and unfortunately Bill Hemming had to race his Elfin in the M&O race due to conflicting race timing with his other car entered.

The track was slower than last year due to inclement weather on most days, and the lap record holder Jonathan Williamson was 1.4 sec slower than his previous best time. The races had similarities to the Phillip Island event earlier in the year with the leading cars circulating with minimum distance between their tyres on many of the corners, and fractions of a second between each race time.

The first two of four races were points scoring towards the AFJA Trophy, and both were won by Jonathan Williamson (Lotus 22) with the first race margin of  $1000^{TH}$  of a second to Peter Strauss in  $2^{nd}$  place, and Don Thallon (MRC) in  $3^{rd}$ . Ed Holly driving his F3 Brabham won the  $3^{rd}$  race, and Peter Strauss (BT6) the fourth.

The racing took its toll on certain cars during the weekend, including the MRC of Don Thallon with damaged camshaft, and the Rennmax of Noel Bryen that was flying till it dropped a valve on Saturday.

Kim Shearn (Lotus 18) enjoyed close competition with Graham Brown (BT2) and Peter Johnson (BT6) enjoyed the company of Frank Hook (T76 F3) in most of the races.

Included in the grid were 2 cars from NZ, a FWD Emerson Elfin driven by Nigel Russell, and the front engine Taraschi of Roger Herrick. Jeff Brown from Vic. drove his recently acquired Brabham F3 in his first race and improved his lap times by 5 seconds, and Mike Gosbell had his new Cooper T52 moving even faster with more experience on the track, as did Norm Falkiner in his attractive Stanguellini.

Derek Smith enjoyed himself driving the Lynx Borgward, as did Dennis Neal in his beautifully presented Lynx BMC obviously advantaged by local track experience. The spectators and commentators appeared to enjoy the spectacle created by these cars nearly as much as the drivers.



#### **AFJA ANNUAL TROPHY SERIES YEAR 2008**

Kim Shearn from Vic. driving his recently acquired, and well presented Lotus 18 won the coveted "AFJA Annual Perpetual Trophy" in his first year with a near perfect point score, outperforming Graham Brown in his Brabham BT2 who contested all rounds during 2008.

The "Aon Perpetual trophy" donated by Geoff Fry & Assoc. to the driver of the best Australian built car in the Series was won by Don Thallon in the ex Lionel Ayers MRC that he purchased from Murray Bryden at the beginning of the year.

The "Nereo Dizane Memorial Perpetual Trophy" for 1 litre F3 cars with maximum points in each event contested was won by Ed Holly, and whilst there was little competition for the trophy in 2008, it would appear that other cars are being prepared for competition in 2009.

2008 was the Golden Jubilee 50<sup>th</sup> year of Formula Junior, and consequently the AFJA hosted events in Australia for 20 overseas drivers, and a total of 33 local cars from around Australia contested the Trophy Series as illustrated on the current points score sheet.

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# **TECHNICAL REPORT**

At the last Annual General Meeting of the AFJA it was resolved "that a technical working party be formed for canvassing information on the Ford engines liabilities" and after considerable discussion, the committee have agreed upon the appointment of Peter Boel to prepare a working document on the preparation and conservation of Formula Junior engines.

The primary purpose of this proposal was to minimise the cost of producing and maintaining the engines used in our cars, and to increase their reliability by eliminating the proverbial misinformation used to confuse the competition, and replace it with known alternatives that members can afford.

It may be that this submission could contain details of who have the expertise in developing these engines, or and where specialised parts can be obtained to suit different engines, so if you have any information that you believe will advance this proposal, and are prepared to share it with your fellow members, please contact the AFJA Qld. Representative Peter Boel with your ideas.

#### CAMS GROUP FJ PROPOSAL

Further to an article in the last issue of Pitstop # 44, where it was revealed the AFJA would again endeavour to convince CAMS Historic Commission to adopt a new Group FJ from cars currently in existing year based Groups L & M, and in particular, remove the possibility of highly restricted Formula Junior cars from competing with inappropriate Group O cars.

The proposal was put to the Commission in October, and received with courteous enthusiasm until the matter under discussion was confused with date based FIA regulations, and the reaffirmation of the Commissions understanding that FJ / F3 only races are quite acceptable.

It was however agreed that the Chairman of the Historic Eligibility Committee would liaise with the AFJA Secretary in determining which cars comply with FJ regulations, with a view to noting this on existing and future CAMS Log books & C of D's, making Australian cars then eligible to race in Formula Junior events overseas.
